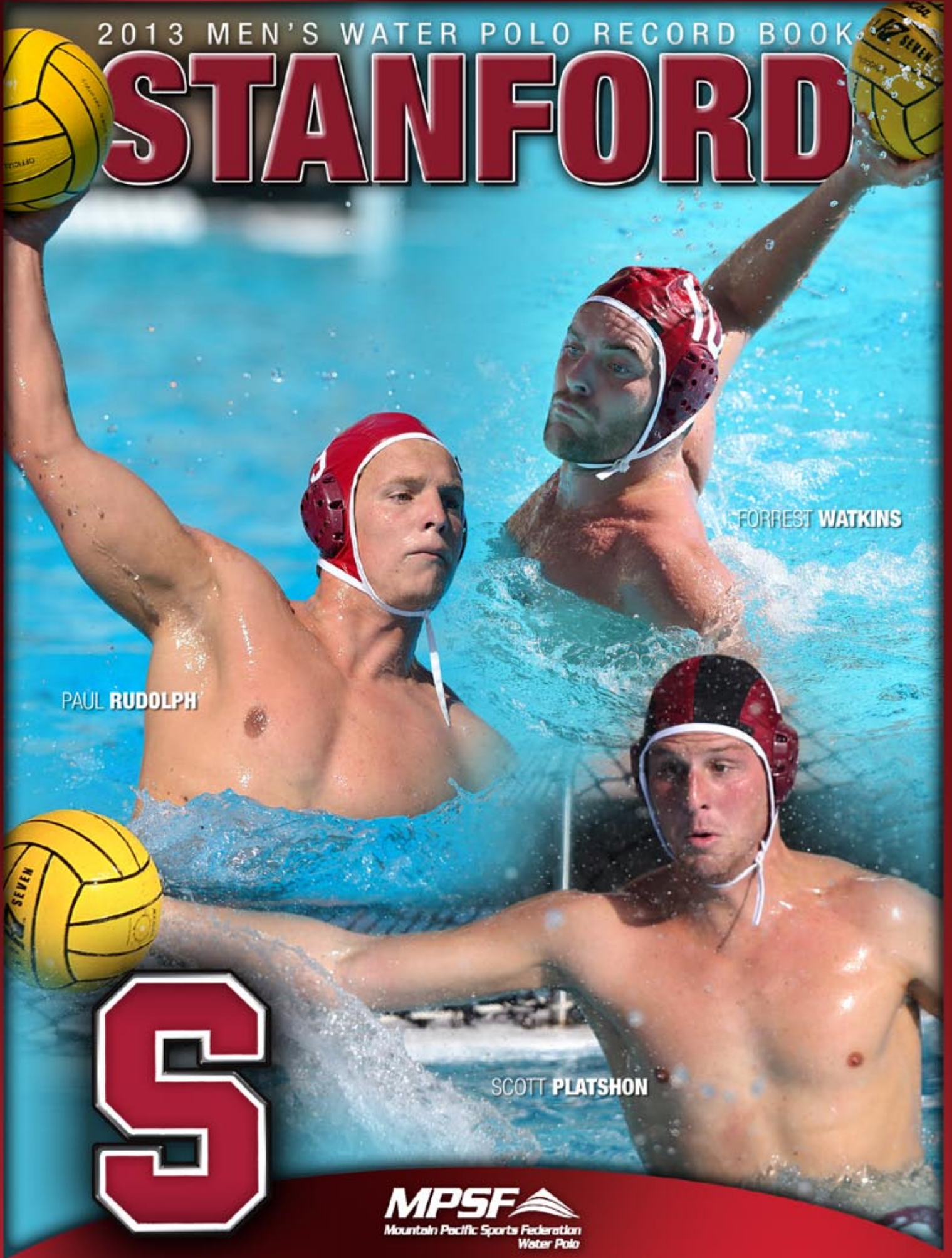

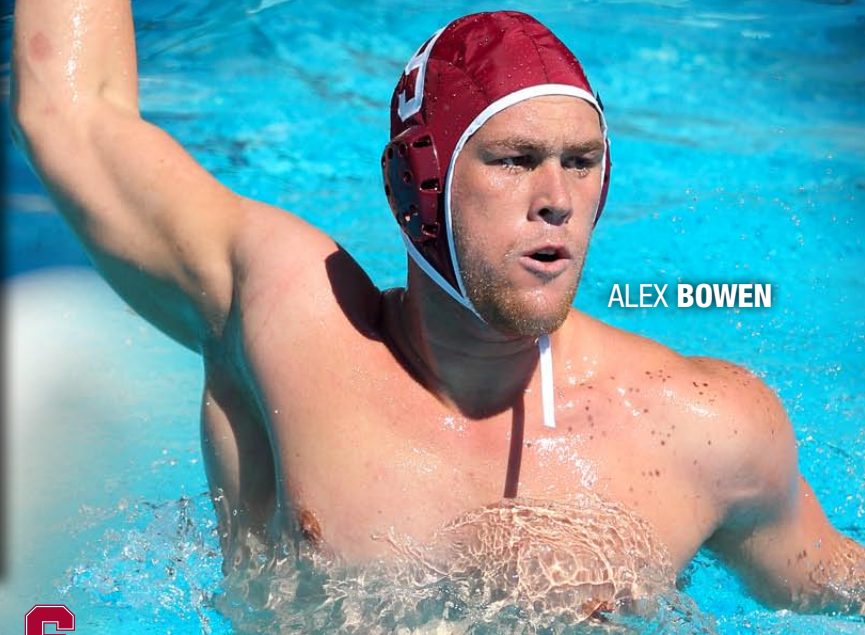

# AVERY AQUATIC CENTER

## HOME OF CHAMPIONS

If Stanford Athletics is recognized as "Home of Champions," then one can argue the most prolific room in the house is the Avery Aquatic Center. Since opening in its current form in 2001, the magnificent facility has been home to five NCAA team champions, 57 individual NCAA titles, 18 Pac-12 Conference team champions, 182 individual Pac-12 titles, six MPSF team titles, five U.S. Collegiate team champs, 20 U.S. Collegiate individual titles and 49 Stanford Olympians (through the 2012 Games) in the sports of men's and women's water polo, men's and women's swimming and diving and synchronized swimming.

The recently rebuilt and remodeled Avery Aquatic Center is the home of all Stanford aquatic teams, and widely considered to be the finest outdoor swimming and diving facility in the United States and perhaps the world.

Initially christened the deGuerre Pool Complex after Dorothy and Sidney deGuerre, the original facility was completed in 1972. In May 1999, an extensive renovation and expansion began that would ensure a world-class home for Stanford Aquatics well into the future. Behind these efforts were the generosity and passion for water sports of Burt and Marion "Pete" Avery and their family.

As it stands today, Avery Aquatic Center features four separate pools: the Avery Competition Pool, the Maas Diving Center, the Belardi Pool and the Baker Pool. The main attraction is the Competition Pool, which can hold up to 2,530 spectators in a facility designed to host all of Stanford's water polo, swimming, and synchronized swimming events. One of the fastest pools in the nation, the Competition Pool is 37 meters long and 20 meters wide. It tapers from 11-14 feet deep and features dual one-meter and three-meter Maxiflex springboards on the south end.

The Avery Stadium Pool also features a scoreboard on the north end, installed and built by Daktronics.

Belardi Pool and Baker Pool stand as a pair of top-rate training pools which offer Stanford student-athletes and coaches tremendous flexibility when designing training programs. The Belardi Pool is 50 meters long, 25 meters wide and tapers to a depth of 11 feet in the center, while the Baker Pool is also 50 meters long, but 25 yards wide and with a varying depth of 4.5-5.5 feet.

The Sandy Foundation Team Room (men's) is located on the east side of the pool deck. The Harold A. Miller Team Room (women's) is located on the west side of the deck level. In 2000, two additional team locker rooms were completed: the Men's Timkin Team Room and the Women's Team Room.

Construction began in 2007 on the Avery Video Center, which added 2,000 square feet to the existing Avery Aquatic Center. At a cost of \$1.4 million, the Avery Video Center provides a meeting facility for all aquatic sports programs, as well as state-of-the-art video equipment for game-planning and scouting purposes.

The Avery Aquatic Center has served as host of many conference and national championships. The facility has hosted the National Collegiate Men's Water Polo Championship three previously (2004, 2007 and 2008) and will host the event once more in 2013, in addition to twice hosting the MPSF Men's Water Polo Tournament (2004, 2010).

The inaugural National Collegiate Women's Water Polo Championship was held at Avery Aquatic Center in May of 2001, and the facility has hosted the women's championship twice more, in 2004 and 2008. Avery has also hosted the women's MPSF Championship on two occasions (2003 and 2012).

In 2008 and 2012, Avery Stadium was the site of the U.S. Women's Water Polo Team's pre-Olympic exhibition tours. Avery Stadium hosted the U.S. against Australia in the finale of the "Blastoff 2 Beijing" Series on July 10, 2008, an event that drew a then-record 2,926 fans. This past July 2, the facility hosted the opener of a five-game "Lunging 2 London" series against Hungary.

# STANFORD MEN'S WATER POLO AT THE OLYMPICS

Stanford men's water polo has been a major player on the U.S. Olympic Teams since the early 20th century. In the 21 Summer Games that have taken place since the 1924 Paris Games, Stanford has boasted at least one representative as a player or coach on the U.S. squad on 18 of those occasions. From the trio of Arthur Austin, Elmer Collett and Wally O'Conner in 1924 to the foursome of Tony Azevedo, Layne Beaubien, Peter Hudnut and Peter Varellas at the 2012 London Games, a total of 29 Stanford men have helped the U.S. capture a total of six Olympic medals (three silver, three bronze).

Of the 29 Stanford graduates that have gone on to be part of the U.S. Olympic Team, five have participated in a playing and/or coaching capacity at least three times. Wally O'Conner represented the U.S. four times (1924, '28, '32, '36), helping the squad to bronze medals at the 1924 Paris Games and the 1932 Los Angeles Games, while Tony Azevedo (2000, '04, '08, '12) helped the U.S. to a silver medal at the 2008 Beijing Games. Since 1996, Cardinal alumni Wolf Wigo (1996, 2000, '04) and Layne Beaubien (2004, '08, '12) have represented the U.S. at three Olympic Games, while Austin R. Clapp played for the U.S. at the 1928 and 1932 Games then coached the American squad at the 1948 London Games.

Eleven additional Stanford alumni have been named to the U.S. Olympic Team as a player or coach on two occasions. Peter Hudnut (2008, '12) and Peter Varellas (2008, '12) were the most recent two-timers, each making their second Olympic appearance this past summer in London. Current Stanford women's head coach and 1982 graduate John Tanner served as an assistant coach on the U.S. men's team in 1992 and 2000.

In all, 20 Stanford alumni have won an Olympic medal as a member of the U.S. Men's Water Polo Olympic Team.

Stanford head coach John Vargas, who took the reins of the Cardinal program in 2002, has thrice been part of the U.S. Olympic Team as well, as a player at the 1992 Barcelona Games, an assistant coach at the 1996 Atlanta Games and as head coach of the squad at the 2000 Sydney Games, where he led the U.S. to a sixth-place finish.

# STANFORD'S CHAMPIONSHIP WATER POLO TRADITION

Over the 44 seasons since the NCAA first sponsored a men's water polo national championship in 1969, Stanford has been an enduring model of excellence. Since that first season, the Cardinal has reached the NCAA Tournament 27 times, played in the national championship game on 20 occasions and captured 10 national titles.

Stanford has finished sixth or better nationally in 36 of the 44 seasons since the NCAA began sponsoring men's water polo.

Stanford is one of just two schools in the country to have two undefeated seasons, with the 1981 team posting a 31-0 record and the 1986 squad going 36-0. The 1981 team produced three Olympians and the 1986 squad had two players that competed on the 1992 Olympic team. The 1976 championship team also produced three Olympians.

The 1981 team set two NCAA records - the most goals scored in an NCAA championship game with 17 and the largest scoring margin, at 11 goals (17-6 over Long Beach State). Stanford holds the NCAA record of 51 consecutive wins, set over three seasons (1985-87).

Stanford has produced 96 individual All-Americans, 32 members of the U.S. Senior National Team, 18 Olympians and 24 members of the USA World University Games team since 1975.

Of the 96 Cardinal All-Americans, nine were bestowed the honor in each of their four years on The Farm. That group includes John Gansel (1977-80), Jody Campbell (1978-81), Alan Mouchawar (1978-81), James Bergeson (1979-82), David Imbernino (1983-86), Todd Kemp (1985-89), Wolf Wigo (1991-94), Nick Ellis (1999-2002) and Tony Azevedo (2001-04).

Stanford has had 21 players inducted into the U.S. Water Polo Hall of Fame and three inducted into the International Water Polo Hall of Fame.

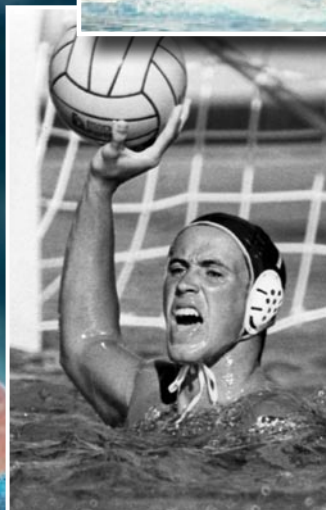

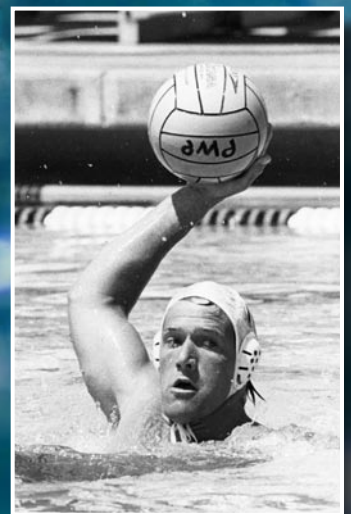

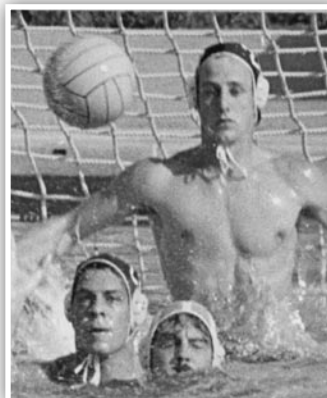
